♦ *State v. Lemieux*, 726 N.W.2d 783, 2007 Minn. LEXIS 14 (2007): Entry of residence in close proximity to a brutal and seemingly random homicide was justified under the emergency aid exception, where a torn window screen, an open window, the unlatched door, and music inside that was skipping provided officers with reasonable grounds to believe that a burglary was in progress or had recently occurred, the entry was motivated primarily to look for possible victims, and the scope of the search was limited to the emergency.
