

Missouri Case Law

♦ *State v. Goff*, 129 S.W.3d 857, 2004 Mo. LEXIS 34 (Mo. 2004): The collective information possessed by the two officers involved in the investigatory stop of defendant's vehicle and subsequent frisk of his person established reasonable suspicion of criminal activity. The collective information in the possession of those with a nexus to the investigation can be considered in determining whether reasonable suspicion exists.

♦ *State v. Brown*, 784 S.W.2d 903, 1990 Mo. App. LEXIS 321 (1990): Officer's entry into home was reasonable and valid, where he had responded to several calls to an emergency number reporting a disturbance in defendant's home. The calls plus the scream from inside the home constituted sufficient exigent circumstances for a warrantless entry.
